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## HOW TO USE THE CARD DECK



Characters Unite Cards may be used by educators as flash cards to promote class discussion, as writing assignment prompts, or as an interactive game played in groups of 4 to 6 players. It can be part of the Characters Unite Activity Guide or used separately.

## Card Suits

### **C** Character

Share something about your background and culture.

### **A** Assumption

Consider how you may view other people.

### **P** Perception

Think about how other people may perceive you.

### **S** Scenario

Imagine how you might act in a specific situation.



# Game Guidelines



## GOAL

The player who is the first to answer one card from each category in the deck wins.

## PLAYERS

Game is played in groups of 4-6 players, with a full or half deck per group.



## RULES

- The player whose last name comes first alphabetically starts the game.
  - Players take turns drawing cards in clockwise rotation.
  - Place deck face down in a draw pile.
  - Players have up to 2 minutes to answer each question. **Yes or No answers are not allowed.** Players should include as much detail as possible up to the time limit.
  - After a card is played, the player must lay their card face up in view of the other players.
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# Gameplay Option #1



## WHAT'S MY CHARACTER?

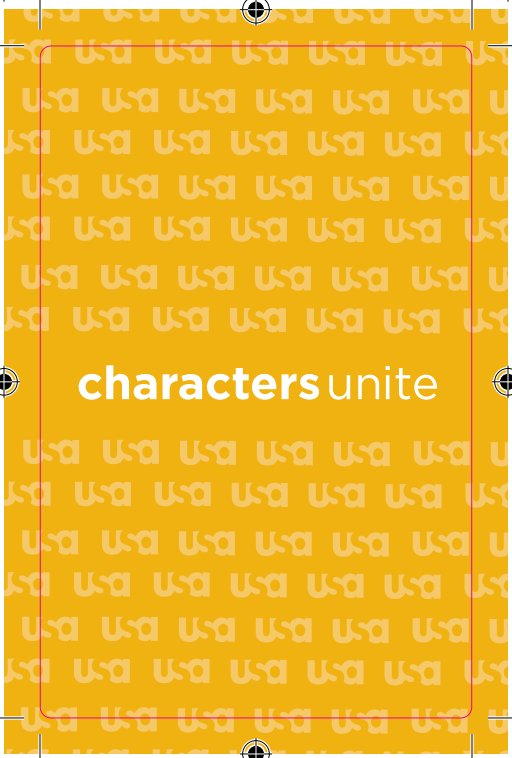
- Each player must play the card they draw unless they decide to “push” a card onto another player or “pass” on a card to discard it without answering. **Each player may push and pass only one card per game.**
  - If a player receives a push card, they must either play it during their turn or use their one pass option. No player may receive more than one push card per game.
  - The first person to play all four card categories wins the game.
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## Gameplay Option #2

### CHARACTER CHALLENGE

- All players start with one card.
  - The first player draws a second card and chooses one card to answer.
  - The player then pushes their unused card to another player.
  - With every turn, players must have two cards in their hand, either drawn from the draw pile or received from another player.
  - Each player chooses a card to answer and pushes the unused card to another player.
  - No player may pass a card to another player who already has two cards.
  - The first person to play all four card categories wins the game.

Imagine you walk by a group of students physically or verbally bullying another student. Would you stop and intervene, keep walking, or go find help? Why?
